

Community Education Fact Sheet

What is Community Education?

Gambler's Help provide Community Education sessions aimed to raise awareness of problem gambling issues, responsible gambling practices and support services available to the community.

Who can access Community Education?

Sessions are available to anyone in the community who wishes to find out more about gambling. This includes schools, community groups, clients groups and the general public. Please note that due to the demand for sessions there may be a waiting period for delivery.

What topics do the sessions cover?

The following topics are often addressed by a session:

- The odds of gambling
- The signs of problem gambling
- The impacts of gambling
- Reducing the harm caused by gambling
- Available support services

However, the sessions can be tailored to the individual needs of a group, as can the length of the session provided.

Where are Community Education sessions delivered?

Community Education sessions are typically delivered on site at the host organisation or community group. Alternatively arrangements can be made for the program to be delivered at the Community Health premises.
